# **Dialogue on Heart Failure**

22 April, 2016 @ University Glasgow, UK

This dialogue aims to identify some crucial challenges in the area of heart failure and diseases for the next 20 years as seen by clinicians today, which may be tractable to a mathematical modelling approach. Starting with some review-type talks by the lead speakers, we wish to have a lively dialogue between clinicians and modellers, and agree on a list of important problems; some may be addressed in the short term, and some will require longer term, large scale, funding. These problems will be published at the POEMS/SofTMech websites to help the community to develop new research proposals and forge new collaborations. All participants will be expected to contribute to the discussion, and are welcome to bring a one-page brief (mini-poster) to introduce their own expertise. It is also expected that all participants will submit a short description on what they perceive as a particular challenge/problem from this workshop.
